Privacy Statement

1. Introduction

Westinghouse Legal Partners B.V., located at De Boelelaan 32-3 1083 HJ, Amsterdam, and registered with the Dutch Chamber of Commerce under number 50705474 ("WLP-Law") is the data administrator and handles your data with the utmost care and in conformity with the Personal Data Protection Act/General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), effective May 25, 2018 and other applicable regulation.

In this privacy statement, WLP-Law provides information concerning (i) the basis on which we process personal data we collect from you, (ii) the purpose of data processing in the context of our website, and (iii) the rights you have in this respect when using our services and website.

2. Scope

This privacy statement applies to all persons whose personal data is processed by WLP-Law, with the exceptions of persons working at WLP-Law, including:

- all other persons who contact WLP-Law or of whom WLP-Law processes personal data.

3. Personal data processing

WLP-Law processes the following personal data:

- Personal data you have provided to WLP-Law, including:
 - o Contact details and other personal data necessary to have your case handled; and
 - o Contact details provided during introductory meetings, events, seminars etc.
- Personal data generated during your visit to the website, including:
 - o IP-addresses and numbers; and
 - Your browsing behavior on our website (i.e. which pages are visited).
- Personal data WLP-Law has obtained from other sources, including:
 - Personal data available on public (professional) social media platforms, including LinkedIn and Facebook; and
 - Personal data obtained from the Trade Register of the Chamber of Commerce and the Land Registry.

4. Purposes and legal basis for processing personal data

WLP-Law processes your personal data if necessary for the following legal grounds and purposes:

• Giving consent to WLP-Law, including:

- Providing a copy of an identity document (passport) for (financial) administration and personal identification purposes.
- Fulfilling legal obligations of WLP-Law, including:
 - The Act on Prevention of Money Laundering and Financing of Terrorism (Wwft)
 requires lawyers and tax consultants to verify the identity of its clients and report
 unusual transactions to the authorities in certain circumstances.
- Execution of an agreement or the period prior to the execution of an agreement, including:
 - Providing legal and tax services concerning an instruction that is given to WLP-Law;
 and
 - o Invoicing of the provided services.
- Representing the legitimate interest of WLP-Law, including:
 - Maintaining contact with you; and
 - o Improving and securing our website: www.wlp-law.com.

5. Retention period

WLP-Law will not store your personal data any longer than is necessary to achieve the purposes stated in this Privacy Statement or to comply with the relevant laws and regulations.

6. Recipients of personal data

WLP-Law may provide your personal data to third parties if this is necessary to achieve the above-mentioned objectives. This depends on the circumstances of the case, including:

- In case of (legal) proceedings against a counterparty;
- In case of closing an agreement or drawing up a notarial deed involving several parties;
- In case of executing of a court ruling; and
- In case of reorganizing or merging our company or selling (a part of) our company.

7. Transfer outside the European Economic Area (EEA)

WLP-Law may transfer personal data to parties located outside of the European Economic Area (EEA) if this is necessary to achieve the above-mentioned objectives. This depends on the circumstances of the case, including the execution of an agreement to provide legal or tax services or a legal claim for which we provide legal support. Under the General Data Protection Regulation, personal data may only be transferred to parties outside of the EEA if a similar level of data protection is offered by contract or adhere to an approved code of conduct or an approved certification mechanism.

servers in the United States; a country which does not provide for a similar level of data protection as
